14. Rubber Rubber Positive

In the Great Exhibition of 1851, twelve exhibitors showed India Rubber, one of whom was Charles Macintosh, the inventor of the macintosh waterproof coat. This rubber mat is one of the first pressings from its metal mould, and was exhibited at the Great Exhibition.

15. Rubber Rubber Seeds

Rubber is a natural polymer, which has evidently been harvested from a tropical tree species since the 16th century when its use to make balls was recorded in Central America. These 14 rubber seeds were part of a batch of 70,000 brought to England from the valley of the Amazon by Sir Henry Wickham in 1876. This batch formed the basis of the Malaya Rubber Plantations.
