THE NORTH BRITISH RUBBER GARDEN.
In the Palace of Industry near the Gate of Harmony, British Empire Exhibition. The flowers, grass, earth, tiles, crazy paving, bird-bath and gold fish are made of rubber. The crazy path in imitation of stone of varying hues, has green rubber moss filling the interstices, with occasional weeds of rubber. The lawns of green crepe rubber have rubber daisies springing up here and there, while the flower borders are made of fine ground rubber. In the rubber fountain are rubber goldfish, rubber water lilies, and other aquatic plants. The edgings of the flower beds and pathways are red rubber tiles, and rubber rambler roses and clematis are climbing the loggia. The garden was created to demonstrate the numerous possibilities of manufactured rubber.
